### Administration – Chief Moore

- Most of the month was spent finalizing budget items and implementing 2023.
- I met with two potential board members. Neither were overly interested in running for office. I have retained their contact information for future usage.
- I coordinated between legal counsel and the County Clerk's Office for the election needs. Notice of election for both the levy and board seats has been filed.
- We have one Captain opening and two Firefighter openings. Both processes are beginning soon.
- I traveled to Buffalo, NY for the last week of the year.
- I have several speaking opportunities lined out over the next month with community organizations with questions about our levy campaign.
- We have not had any success purchasing the new staff vehicles. Pricing changes have created barriers to a quick resolution.
- I will be traveling to Phoenix on the 24<sup>th</sup>.

### Operations – Deputy Chief Reynolds

- Total calls for December = 227
  - 9 Building fires
  - Total Calls YTD = 2170
  - Through December 2021 = 2859
- Average Response Time for December = 5.54 minutes
  - Average Response Time YTD = 5.41 minutes
  - Target time is 7:00 minutes
- Turnout time for December = 1:22
  - Turnout time YTD = 1:22
  - Target time is 1:30
- Year End Information:
  - Call total for BFPD for 2022 is 4245 calls through Greene County 9-1-1. Of those, 2075 were FEMS2 calls. These are the calls where someone in our District called 9-1-1 for a non-emergency medical situation and we were not dispatched.
- Lexipol on-boarding:
  - All line personnel have logged into the system and are beginning to acknowledge existing documents. We will have new releases in the coming months.
- 144812 (New Pumper).
  - Multiplex issue was resolved, and the truck is back with us. Josh has a few outlets to finish. Personnel are getting their drive time and competencies completed.
  - Pre-con on 144813 was done. I am awaiting the document to agree on the changes discussed.
  - I will be working with a new group on the next new build. I should have some preliminary numbers mid-year.
- Battalion Chief vacancy has been filled by Josh Dukewits. We will schedule a pinning and promotional ceremony soon.
- Captain vacancy has been advertised for Chief Dukewits position. Chief Burr is also working on the assessment center schedule.
- Our recruits have reported to their shifts/stations.

#### **Community Risk Reduction Activities**

- Total people reached through social media, the District website and Google Business = 8,109
- Crews replaced 6 smoke alarms and 5 batteries for citizens.
- Assisted the District Fire Academy with live burn training.
- Attended the District and Regional CRR meetings.
- Attended the Greene County LEPC meeting.
- Reviewed construction plans for a new structure within District boundaries.
- Attended a meeting with Springfield Fire to review their Collector App for pre-planning.
- Scheduled an interview with KY3 and Battalion Chief Wits.
- Assisted Springfield Fire with conducting Fire Inspector I skills testing.
- Assisted the Township Senior Living facility with safety education and inspection.
- Crews participated in numerous PR events including Shop with a Hero and the Battlefield Christmas Parade.
- Completed a college level statistics course to assist with an update of the District's community risk assessment.

#### **Workers Compensation, Safety, and Human Resources**

- The District had no work comp claims for this period.
- Continued to monitor active work comp claims.
- Completed a coronary calcium test to promote the new CCT program.
- Attended a meeting to discuss dental and vision services for 2023.
- Attended the District Health and Wellness Committee meeting.
- Attended the District Safety Committee meeting
- Conducted and participated in ongoing HR training for our new Admin Assistant.

### **Training – Division Chief Burr**

- Training hours for December: 1,095 hours
  - Total Hours for 2022 = 15,222 hours
    - Total Hours for 2021 = 11,807 hours.
- The Recruit Academy has finished up and all 7 recruits completed the academy.
- The Academy Graduation was postponed due to inclement weather. We are working on a new date.
- I am continuing to work with OTC for the EMT class. I don't have any further information at this point.
- I am in the process of gathering updated pricing on PPE and SCBAs for a possible grant application.
- I will be starting a hiring process and scheduling a Company Officer Assessment to fill current vacancies.



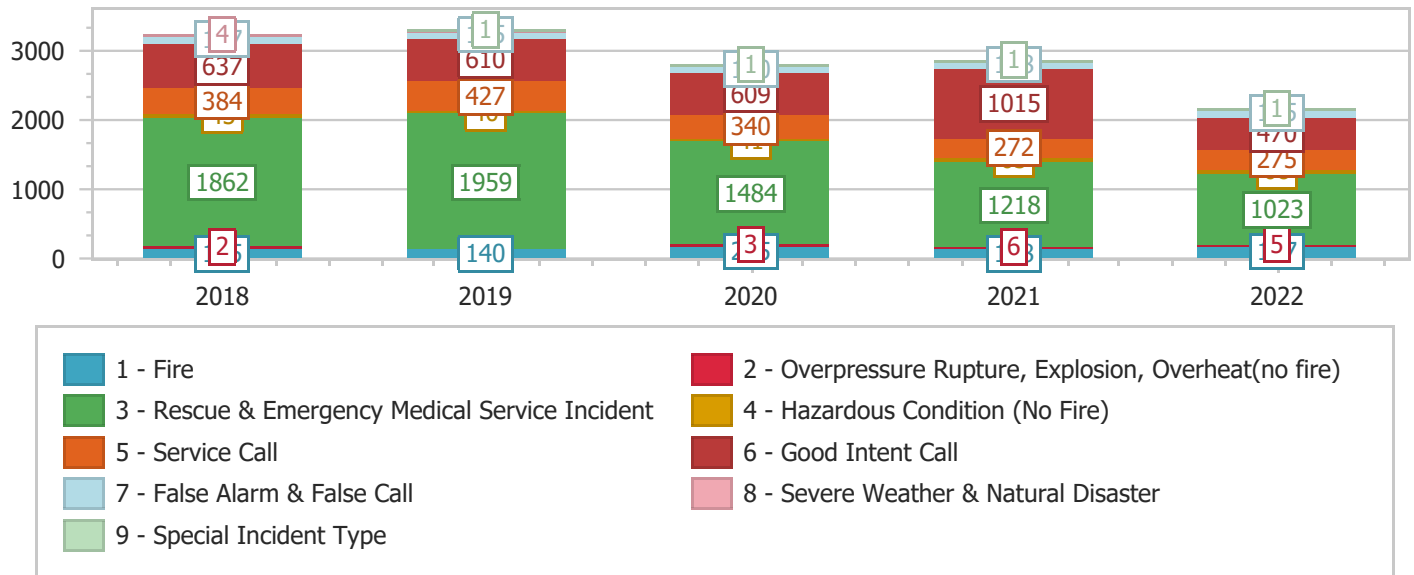
